

Campus SaVE Learning Program

Higher education institutions are expected to make a “good faith effort” to comply with the Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act (Campus SaVE Act), which became effective in March 2014. Part of the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013 (VAWA), the law comes at a time of multiple high-profile government investigations of campus response to sexual misconduct allegations and a recent White House Task Force report on protecting students from sexual assault.

Does your institution have plans to meet the “good faith effort”? This EduRisk learning program can help you take steps toward meeting the Campus SaVE compliance requirements.

The learning program includes:

Campus SaVE Act online course (three versions):

Introduction to the *Campus SaVE Act for Students*, which covers the new law and how it affects students, including:

- Recognizing and preventing specific types of sexual violence offenses
- Warning signs of abuse
- Bystander intervention
- What steps victims of sexual violence should take

Introduction to the *Campus SaVE Act for Employees* is modeled after the student course and provides this information from the faculty/staff perspective.

Legal implications of the *Campus SaVE Act for Administrators* provides a more thorough legal understanding of the act, including:

- An overview of the Campus SaVE Act, Clery Act, and VAWA
- The expanded categories of hate crimes that must be reported
- An education and training checklist

A publication, *The Campus SaVE Act: A Compliance Guide*, offers key definitions, compliance recommendations, a compliance checklist, and additional resources available only to UE members.



Who Would Benefit From This Learning Program

Because compliance with Campus SaVE involves multiple constituencies on campus, online courses are available for students, faculty/staff, and administrators. It is highly recommended that Title IX coordinators, crisis response team members, and general counsel complete this learning program.
